History: Bass Playground was purchased in 1928, but the playground existed informally before the purchase of the land was made by the Parks and Recreation Department. Many people submitted letters of interest including one from the law firm of Vesey and Shoaff. The letter included the writer's own experience of playing baseball in the park as a boy. The life and size of Bass Playground continued to expand in 1966 and 1967.


Today Bass Playground features a basketball court and a playground with a slide and swing set among other fun amenities.




FOELLINGER-FREIMANN BOTANICAL CONSERVATORY

The **Foellinger–Freimann Botanical Conservatory** opened in 1983, the conservatory contains a 25,000-square-foot seasonal showcase garden, a tropical oasis display, with a waterfall, a Sonoran desert display, an outdoor terrace and exploration garden, encompassing a total of 100,000-square-feet. The gardens display over 1,200 plants of 502 different species and 72 types of cactus.




