Financial Objective and Justification Statement

Hurshtown Reservoir was built in 1969 to provide the City of Fort Wayne with water in the event of a drought. It contains 1.8 billion gallons of water which are pumped in from the St. Joseph River. The reservoir is 260 acres surrounded by 100 acres of land. The average depth is 20 feet. City Utilities owns this property and Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation Department (FWPRD) operates the facility from May – October of each year. We offer a variety of recreational opportunities including, fishing, boating (trolling motor only), kayaking, biking, picnicking, and walking around the 2.75 miles loop that surrounds the reservoir. This property has a concrete boat ramp along with three dock sections that are installed each year making it accessible for fishermen, paddlers, and those interested in renting kayaks or rowboats.

While competitor fees have increased fees at **Hurshtown Reservoir have not increased since 2004**. See attached Comparable Competition. The financial objective for Hurshtown Reservoir is that the ratio of revenues to costs equals 100%. To stay comparable to our competition and to cover our increasing labor expenses, we recommend increasing all of the current fees. See attached proposed fees.
