COST CENTERS: Community Center Funds 121-R432, 428-R432

FINANCIAL OBJECTIVE AND JUSTIFICATION STATEMENT:

- Increase rental revenue to offset increasing costs of utilities, staffing, and other operational expenses.
- Increase capital improvement fund (non-reverting capital fund 428) to help with equipment replacement and basic facility improvements.

PROPOSAL:

- Increase most rental fees 5-10% to help offset increased costs. Fees were last increased in February 2022
- Deposit 25% of each rental into the non-reverting capital fund 428. The fund is used for the purchase of equipment, facility improvements, and upgrades. Examples would be (but not limited to) replacement of tables and chairs, upgrades to sound equipment, upgrades to light fixtures, replacement of kitchen equipment, new kitchen equipment, storage racks, beautification of exterior, etc.

PROJECTED RESULTS OUTCOME:

An additional *\$2,400 in revenue is expected from this increase. *based on 2024 revenues

COMPETITION:

The proximity to many downtown attractions makes the Community Center an attractive rental venue for many events, such as anniversary parties, wedding receptions, birthday parties, church gatherings, and other community events. The Community Center's advantages over other reception facilities include offering no restrictions on catering, being centrally located, free parking, a tastefully appointed large lobby area, and the use of a full restaurant-style kitchen is included with each rental. Very few, if any, venues offer the opportunity to control your own catering solutions. It has traditionally kept its rates affordable, and these revenues help to reduce the operational costs of the facility. By increasing the rental rates, the Community Center will still be affordable compared to other venues but yet still keep up with the industry standards.

FINANCIAL OBJECTIVE AND JUSTIFICATION STATEMENT:

Headwaters Park, located just north of the central city business district, is home to many festivals, concerts, charitable and other special events. The large open-air pavilion is available for public rental and makes a wonderful setting for weddings, receptions, company picnics, and family reunions. During the cold weather months, the pavilion houses the popular Headwaters Ice Skating Rink. In the late 1990s, the developing Headwaters Park project became one of the largest public-private partnerships in Northern Indiana.

On April 1, 2023, the Fort Wayne Parks Department took over the operation of Headwaters Park from the Headwaters Park Alliance. For the 2025-2026 skating and festival season, we have increased our fees to account for additional labor, material, and utility costs. Even with these fee increases, we remain at or below our competition.



ANTICIPATED REVENUE IMPACTS

We anticipate these rental fee increases at Headwaters will bring an additional \$6,000 in revenue for 2026. Changes to the ice rink fees anticipate another \$10,000 in additional revenue.

Headwaters Park Ice Rink Concessions

Manager of Riverfront may adjust pricing after total cost with mark-ups between 50-200%. Concession items will be review and priced at the start of the Ice-Skating season no later than November $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of each year. They will remain the same throughout the season unless the item increases significantly in cost, in which time the Riverfront Manager will cost out items using the pricing guidelines. Items that do not sell after a minimum of 30 days on display will be

reviewed by the Riverfront Manager. The Riverfront Manager may implement a price markdown to move stock before it expires.

PROPOSAL:


